- Testa Home/Invasion Robber unsolved Whitpain Police - 9/19/2024
- Handicapped Child and Father Alleged Assaulted Whitpain Police
- Former Whitpain Police Employee vs. Whitpain Police - 2024
- Joseph Nero vs Whitpain Township Police - 2024

Robbery Incident Overview

- The burglary occurred at Scott Testa and his partners home Hulda's home in Whitpain Township Blue Bell, PA.
- Two perpetrators were involved, but only one has been charged with two summary offenses.
- The estimated damage to the home is \$9,000, with stolen property valued at \$20,000, including irreplaceable jewelry.

Evidence and Communications

- The document includes burglary videos, threats from perpetrators, and communications with police.
- Text messages and phone calls show threats made by Jeffrey Cassera and Brent Bowers before the break-in.
- Videos of the incident show two individuals resembling Brent Bowers and Jeff Cassera entering and leaving the house.

Legal Proceedings

- A hearing was initially scheduled for December 18, 2024 (case numbers MJ-38121-NT-0000278-2024 and MJ-38121-NT-0000252-2024).
- Scott Testa requested a continuance and Zoom access to the hearing, citing safety concerns.

- The judge initially denied these requests but later granted a continuance upon the prosecution's request.
- The case is now scheduled for a new date in January 2025.

Investigation and Review

- Testa has repeatedly requested updates from the Whitpain Township Police Department, which have been denied.
- The Montgomery County District Attorney's Office is independently reviewing the charging decision.
- Brianna Ringwood, Deputy District Attorney and Chief of Professional Standards, oversees this review.
- There is also text messages from another victim of Whitpain Police with an altercation involving one of his handicapped sons proclaiming that he felt the Whitpain Police were very unethical and perhaps unlawful in how they dealt with his situation.

Concerns Raised

- Testa expresses fear for his family's safety due to the uncharged perpetrator.
- He raises concerns about being unfairly targeted as part of a mixed-race couple.
- There are allegations of lack of communication from the police department and discrepancies in their claims of working with an Assistant District Attorney.
- The number of alleged abuses by the Whitpain Police

This summary provides an overview of the complex situation involving the burglary, subsequent legal proceedings, and ongoing investigations.

Description and timeline of 951 Netherwood burglary robbery

Attached are the threats made to Hulda and me before the break-in.

1. The first photo is a screenshot of a group text that Jeffrey Cassera sent to Hulda and me on September 17th at 5:22 PM, two days before the break-in. He created the group chat and sent that message, to which only Hulda responded. I did not respond to Jeffrey Cassera.
2. The second photo is a screenshot of a text from Jeffrey Cassera to my cell phone, sent on September 17th at 3:58 PM. I have yet to respond to that message, too. It read, "Just matter of time". I cannot tell what time was supposed to bring, other than the fruition of his threats and more made to us earlier and later that day.
3. The third photo is a screenshot of two incoming calls from Jeffrey Cassera to Hulda on September 17th at 10:49 AM. She answered the calls thinking it was the son, the actual tenant, George Cassera, and as she answered and said hello, Jeffrey Cassera answered, "Are you the dumb bitch that has been causing my son a lot of stress since he moved into your apartment?" And as Hulda tried to reason with him and explain the situation, he did not allow her to put a word in a continued saying, "I am coming down there to sue the shit out of you and sue your ass." She hung up. He immediately called a second time and made some more provoking and attacking statements, including but not limited to racial slurs. She hung up again and only took another call from him later that afternoon, where he kept threatening her.
4. The fourth photo is a screenshot of my call history, and it shows five (5) phone calls from a Delaware phone number, which, when researched, belonged to Brent Bowers, the father of George Cassera's girlfriend. I also want to stress that Brent Bowers matches the physique of one of the two men who broke into the house two days later. You will also find a missed call from a Maryland number on the day marked "Tuesday." This is Jeffrey Cassera's phone number (+1 240 418 0808). I never answered any phone calls from any of those numbers, and they never left any voicemails. The last incoming unanswered call was from Brent Bowers late on September 18th, and no attempt to communicate was made on September 19th, the day of the break-in.
5. Hulda and I attest that we left the lockbox containing the jewelry and key fobs in the attic on the morning of September 2nd after cleaning the apartment for George Cassera to move in at 4 PM that day. The attic is locked and inaccessible unless you have the code to the door, which no one else but us two did.

On the day of the break-in, before the police allowed us access to the house, I asked what doors had been broken down. They responded that all the doors, except one connected to George's unit, had been kicked down, including the attic door next to his bathroom. Upon

receiving permission to enter the house and assess the damage, I went to the attic to make sure everything was in place, and to my greatest dismay, the lockbox was gone. Hulda and I were called about an hour later to the Whitpain Police Department by Officer Rocks, and we reported that this lockbox was missing. They also have a copy of all the documentation I have sent you thus far.

Two days later, Detective Tom was at my house looking for George's computer in my attic, which George supposedly had no access to. And somehow, almost like magic, the computers are there. To this day, I haven't heard anything from Detective Tom about my lockbox, even though I have cooperated with the department to see to it that George got all of his belongings.

I am not sure how much argument I can bring to prove that these people threatened us and then proceeded to break into our home and take some valuables from us that cannot be replaced. I am a bit appalled by the fact that two men broke into my home and carried out two standard 55-gallon trash bags of stuff, and now, I am asked to prove what may or may not have been in the bag. I don't know what was in the bag, but I can also say that my possessions were gone on the night of their break-in.

5. The Cassaras and Bowers stopped all communications with us after the robbery. Whereas before the robbery, there were multiple attempts to contact us via multiple means, including phone calls, text messages and coming to the house and property and threatening us verbally via cameras. Why, after the robbery, did they stop contacting us? The reason is that the robbery did not go as planned, and they were unable to secure the computers they thought about it for a couple of days before they contacted the police to retrieve their computers from my house. Tom Willig never asked for anything but their computers and nothing else.

Additionally, the robber takes not only jewelry but also the food in the house. When Hulda was in the house, there was cereal and all sorts of miscellaneous food and other items that were of no value to anyone but the Cassaras and the Bowers.

6. We believe Bowers was the one who broke the window and cut himself but was too big to fit through the window so Jeff Cassara crawled through the window and over the couch. There was no blood on the couch in front of the broken window because Cassara climbed through and opened the door after Bowers broke it and cut himself. Cassara was not cut.

But there was blood throughout the house because Bowers never went through the window but went throughout the house.

Attached are also videos of them coming into and leaving the house. It just so happens that the two robbers resemble the girl's father, Brent Bowers and Jeff Cassara. I am assuming that the police took blood samples to run DNA.

This is a travesty and a disgrace.

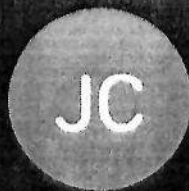

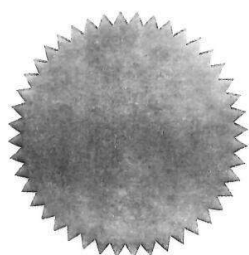

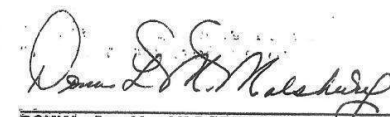

I am writing to formally appeal a Right-to-Know request regarding the robbery at my home on September 19, 2024, at 951 Netherwood Drive, Blue Bell, PA 19422 the last request was denied on November 19, 2024. I previously submitted a request for the report from Whitpain Township on 9/20/24, but that was also denied.

Under the applicable Right-to-Know laws, I am respectfully seeking information about the crime committed at my property. This information is essential for understanding the progress of the investigation and for insurance purposes.

Specifically, I am requesting access to the following:

1. All documents, records, or materials regarding the incident and subsequent investigation.
2. Surveillance or body camera footage related to the incident.

If any portion of my request is being denied, I kindly ask that you provide a detailed explanation, citing the specific legal exemptions being applied. Additionally, if necessary, I request assistance narrowing or refining my request to ensure compliance with applicable laws.

I also ask you to review the video evidence linked below, which details the incident, and consider the lack of clarity provided by Detective Tom Wittig regarding his communications with the District Attorney's Office. Additionally, I am concerned about the lack of communication and transparency regarding the summary charges filed against one of the suspects. This crime resulted in the theft of over \$20,000 worth of jewelry, including irreplaceable items belonging to my late wife, and over \$9,000 in damages to my home.

Thank you for your time and attention to this matter. Please don't hesitate to let me know if you need additional information or documentation to proceed with my appeal. I'm looking forward to hearing back from you.

The Township is in receipt of your request for a copy of the following records: *"Police report for the robbery that occurred at 951 Netherwood Drive, Blue Bell, PA 19422 on September 19th, 2024 at 5:55 PM."*

Your request is denied because the record you requested is not a public record. The requested record is a police incident report, which is exempt from public disclosure pursuant to Section 708(b)(16) Right-To-Know Law ("RTKL"), as a record related to a criminal investigation. 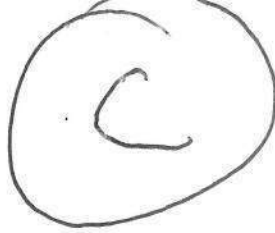

Dear Lieutenant Franco and Lieutenant Sweisfurth,

I am writing to formally express my concerns about handling the burglary at my residence on September 19, 2024. In addition, I seek clarification on several troubling aspects of the investigation, including the lack of communication, potential mishandling of evidence, and overall case management. Below, I have outlined my key concerns:

1. Lack of Communication with the District Attorney's Office

While I acknowledge the summary citations issued to Brent Bowers, I was recently informed during a meeting with the District Attorney's Office that they were unaware of the burglary's details. This is despite Officer Tom Wittig's claims that he had been collaborating with their office. Repeated requests for clarification on which Assistant District Attorney (ADA) was working with Officer Wittig have gone unanswered. This lack of transparency raises severe concerns about the communication and coordination between your department and the DA's office.

2. Unusual Charges for a Serious Crime

Over \$20,000 of items were stolen, and approximately \$9,000 in damages were caused during the burglary. Despite the severity of the crime, Mr. Bowers has been charged only with a summary offense. This seems disproportionate to the nature and extent of the damages. Please explain why the charges were limited to a summary offense and whether more severe charges are under consideration.

3. Unauthorized Communication with My Attorney

I have been informed that Officer Wittig communicated directly with my attorney without my explicit consent. This behavior is both unprofessional and inappropriate. I request clarification on the purpose and nature of these communications and why they occurred without my prior knowledge or approval.

4. Repeated Visits to My Residence

Following the initial break-in, Officer Wittig and other officers visited my residence, reportedly searching for additional stolen items, mainly the computers belonging to the Casseras. These

2-2 repeated visits raise concerns about whether proper evidence-handling protocols were followed and whether the investigation appropriately focused on identifying the primary suspects. During these visits, Officer Wittig did not inquire about my situation as the victim of the crime. Instead, the officers focused on locating the Casseras' computers, even searching my trash. I request clarification on the reasons for these visits and the investigative approach taken.

5. Concerns About the Protection of Certain Individuals

The interests of the Cassera family may have been given undue priority. Following the burglary, officers retrieved their computers from my residence, even though they were implicated in events surrounding the crime. This raises concerns about potential preferential treatment. Can you clarify why these individuals appear to be shielded from further investigation?

6. Lack of Clarity on the Role of the District Attorney

After speaking with the District Attorney's Office, I was directed to address my concerns with Lieutenants within your department. However, I was told that the DA's office is not actively involved in the case and will only intervene after I follow your department's command. This directly contradicts earlier statements that the DA's office was involved. Please identify the ADA Officer Wittig referenced and clarify why the DA's office has not been adequately engaged.

7. Request for a Continuance

In light of these concerns, I formally request that your department contact the District Court to request a continuance. This will allow for a more thorough investigation and proper coordination between all parties involved.

8. Lack of Communication from Officer Wittig

Officer Wittig has yet to respond to multiple emails regarding this case. I request that the District Attorney's Office be immediately involved and that county detectives take charge of this investigation to ensure it is appropriately handled.

Attachments:

Enclosed, please find copies of the estimates and appraisals for the stolen items and damages to help clarify the financial impact of this crime. The assessments and breakdown have been given to the Whitpain Police Department on multiple occasions, including via email the night of the incident with Officer Rocks the following day.

These issues must be addressed promptly to ensure justice is served. I request that all future communications regarding this matter be in writing.

Thank you for your time and attention to these concerns. I look forward to your prompt response and a detailed explanation of the next steps.

Subject: Concerns Regarding Burglary Investigation and Seeking Appropriate Action

Dear Mr. Traub and Chief Lawson,

We are writing to formally address the burglary at my residence, 951 Netherwood Drive, Blue Bell, on **September 19, 2024**, at approximately 5:55 PM. We are deeply concerned about how this case has been handled thus far and seek appropriate justice for the crimes committed.

As advised by the District Attorney's Office, We are contacting the chain of command in Whitpain Township to share my concerns regarding the investigation. Enclosed is a copy of my prior correspondence with the Lieutenants at the Whitpain Township Police Department, which outlines the specific issues encountered during this case.

Since our last communication with the department, it has come to our attention that the Damaged Property Summary charge against Brent Bowers has been withdrawn. However, our property remains in disrepair; the lowest repair estimate I have received is approximately \$9,000. Additionally, while a harassment charge has been filed against Mr. Bowers, there has been no indication of a theft charge despite my dead wife's jewelry being stolen during the burglary.

In a conversation with Detective Tom Wittig two days after the burglary, We were informed that the perpetrators claimed they did not take any jewelry. We were left questioning why the testimony of individuals involved in criminal activity is being treated as credible over the evidence provided by the victim.

Moreover, Detective Wittig informed us that the District Attorney's Office was involved in the case, but this does not appear accurate based on current proceedings. Enclosed are appraisals and proof of ownership for some of the items stolen from my lockbox, which should warrant further involvement from the District Attorney.

It is especially troubling that the dropped charge against Mr. Bowers appears to sever any direct connection to his known accomplices, Jeffrey and George Cassera. This raises significant concerns as efforts are being made to shield these individuals from accountability. Given the circumstances, I am compelled to ask:

- Why has the District Attorney's Office not been more actively involved in prosecuting these severe crimes?
- Why are Jeffrey and George Cassera seemingly excluded from the investigation and potential charges?
- Is there an underlying reason—financial or otherwise—that has led to this perceived lack of accountability?

This situation is even more distressing in light of a prior incident at my home in 2019, where individuals were captured on camera damaging my property. Despite police response to that incident, no arrests or charges were made. This pattern of inaction erodes trust in the department's ability to protect the community and uphold justice.

I am requesting the following:

1. Both burglars should be held accountable with charges that reflect the gravity of their crimes.
2. The Assistant District Attorney, who was referenced by Detective Wittig, actively participated in this case.
3. The case should be reassigned to a County Detectives to ensure impartiality and thoroughness.
4. I Request a Continuance immediately to the Summary charges on December 18th at Blue Bell District Court.

Also, the community should be aware of the continued threat these individuals are to the community. Publicizing this case through appropriate Social Media and News Media channels would warn residents and reinforce trust in the department's commitment to community safety. We have some experience in this area and are willing to assist with such outreach efforts.

We hope to see a renewed focus on this case, addressing these concerns and ensuring justice for my family and community. Thank you for your attention to this matter. We look forward to hearing back from you soon via an email response.

Below is a small sample of the videos we have regarding this situation. We also sent the Liutenenants the attached letter. We sent them access to the videos of the robbery and the information packet we have been putting together regarding this situation to help us solve this crime together. You may have already been privy to this information because we have submitted this information to Whitpain Police multiple times, both in person and electronically, including in person the night of the robbery and the following day via email.

Honorable Suzan G. Leonard,

I am seeking your assistance regarding a robbery at my home in Whitpain Township **on September 19, 2024**. Police responded to the incident with support from Plymouth and East Norriton Township Police Departments.

The damage to my home is estimated at \$9,000, and the stolen property, including irreplaceable jewelry belonging to my late wife, is valued at \$20,000. While two perpetrators were involved, only one has been charged with two summary offenses. The other individual remains uncharged despite the gravity of their involvement.

This lack of accountability has left my family and me fearful for our safety. We are deeply concerned that the uncharged perpetrators may evade consequences and potentially return to harm us.

This email includes burglary videos, threats from the perpetrators, and communications with the police. I would like you to look over the evidence thoroughly and help make sure justice is served so my family can feel safe in our home again.

We have repeatedly requested updates from the Whitpain Township Police Department, but these have yet to be denied. The department has refused to communicate with us about the case's progress and claims to be working with an ADA (Assistant District Attorney). However, when we contacted the District Attorney's Office, they had no record of such communication. Additionally, the police have ignored multiple requests for the incident report and a continuance to this hearing.

In light of these circumstances, I respectfully request:

1. A continuance of the hearing scheduled for **12/18/2024** under case numbers **MJ-38121-NT-0000278-2024** and **MJ-38121-NT-0000252-2024**.
2. Closed-circuit or Zoom access to the hearing.
3. I'd appreciate it if you could review the burglary videos that were provided.

Thank you for your attention to this matter and for considering our plea for justice and safety.

This request is essential to ensure the safety of myself, my family, and our witnesses, given the serious threats we have received through text messages, phone calls, and the break-in and theft at our home. Unfortunately, Whitpain Township, the Whitpain Police Department, or Eric Traub have not adequately addressed these requests.

Also, our prior requests for continuance and access to the incident report have been denied or overlooked. We respectfully request that you reconsider these requests and allow access to the hearing via Zoom. Under the current circumstances, these reasonable accommodations need to be taken care of.

We are deeply concerned that my family is being unfairly targeted as a mixed-race couple. I implore you to review the evidence, including videos and correspondence documenting these incidents, and to consider these matters.

It is also noteworthy that the two individuals depicted in the provided videos closely resemble those who have threatened us previously and are directly connected to the break-in at our home.

Again, Chief Lawson, Judge Leonard, and Eric Traub, please release the incident reports for the robbery at my house, grant me a continuance for the hearing on December 18, and grant myself, my family, and my witnesses, access to the meeting via Zoom.

I have attached links to supporting information and videos detailing these events.

Thank you for your time and consideration. I'm hoping that these requests can be resolved fairly and in a manner that guarantees safety and justice for everyone involved and the community at large.

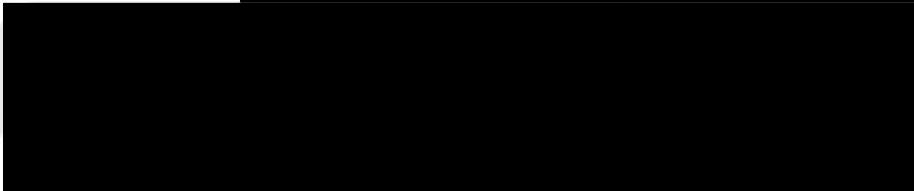
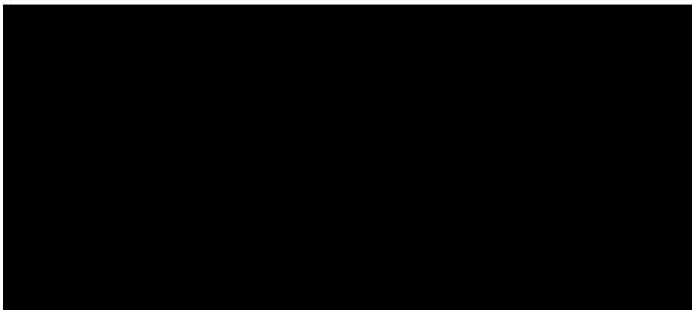

Civil Rights Case - Nero vs. Whitpain Township

Nero v. WHITPAIN TOWNSHIP is a civil rights case filed in the United States District Court for the Eastern District of Pennsylvania³. The case was filed on December 6, 2023, with Michael Nero as the plaintiff⁷. The defendants named in the lawsuit include:

1. Whitpain Township
2. Police Officer Anthony Garced
3. Police Officer Justin Gannon
4. Chief Kenneth Lawson

While specific details about the nature of the civil rights complaint are not provided in the available information, the case appears to involve allegations against the Whitpain Township police department and its officers⁷.

Whitpain Township, the primary defendant, is located in Montgomery County, Pennsylvania. It is a second-class township governed by a five-member Board of Supervisors⁵. The township has a population of over 18,000 residents and is home to several large corporations⁵.

As this is an ongoing legal matter, the outcome and full details of the case are not yet known. Civil rights cases against municipalities and law enforcement often involve claims of constitutional violations or misconduct by government officials.

Whitpain Township Police vs. Former Police Employee 7/16/24

On July 16, 2024, the Whitpain Township Board of Supervisors approved a settlement and general release agreement between Whitpain Township and a Police Department employee identified as Employee No. 10461. The specific details of the settlement were not disclosed in the public meeting minutes.

Township Manager Mr. Traub provided some context for this agreement, stating that the township prefers to reach settlements through discussion rather than engaging in extensive litigation for potential personnel matters¹. He noted that this approach is considered better for handling such issues.

The settlement agreement was subject to acceptance of conditions and final review by legal counsel and the Township Manager¹. The Board of Supervisors approved the motion to accept this agreement, indicating that it had been previously discussed in an executive session.

While the exact nature of the issue or the terms of the settlement were not made public, this approach suggests that the township aimed to resolve a personnel matter efficiently and avoid potential legal complications.

Moreover, I am deeply troubled by the actions of the Whitpain Township Police Department, which has consistently targeted victims and other members of the community.

This pattern of behavior amounts to bullying, and we are determined not to let it continue unchallenged.

The attached packet includes the same questions I have repeatedly posed to Tom Wittig, Ken Lawson, Eric Traub, and Brian Sweisfurtho. Despite sending over ten emails on this matter, including this one, I have yet to receive a satisfactory response.

Why is this happening to my family, other citizens, and even to employees of Whitpain Township? I urge you to address these concerns promptly and with complete transparency.
